This quiz looks at important dates for our biennial precinct meetings, qualifying new members, and the public use of the Democratic Party name.

- 1. Citing the rule in the DPH Constitution, Article II, Section 3A on Biennial Elections (p.2), what date will our biennial precinct meetings be held in 2018 (assuming the SCC doesn't change it)?
  - a. Tuesday, March 6, 2018
  - b. Wednesday, March 7, 2018

- 2. Citing the rule in DPH Bylaws, Article II, Section 2A on Biennial Elections (p.8), what date must the biennial precinct meeting locations, dates and times be published in the newspaper?

  - b. Thursday, December 21, 2017
  - c. Friday, January 5, 2018
  - d. Thursday, February 15, 2018
- 3. Citing the rules in DPH Bylaws Article I Sections 2A(3), 2A(4), 4D, and 6B (pp.2-4), how does the party confirm residence in determining what precinct club a member belongs to?
