It is with pleasure that we submit the report of the Convention Rules Committee for the 2015 O'ahu County Democrats' Convention. 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22 Section 1. Organization of O'ahu County Committee.

There shall be an O'ahu County Committee ("OCC") in the City and County of Honolulu,
State of Hawai'i, which shall consist of an Executive Committee and the District Council
Chairpersons.

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27 Section 2. Executive Committee.

28 (2.1) Composition: The members of the Executive Committee shall be a Chairperson, a

29 Vice Chairperson, Regional Chairpersons, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a

30 Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, and the O'ahu County State Central Committee 31 Representatives.

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(2.2) Duties. The duties of the Executive Committee shall be those usually pertaining to
 the office concerned, any duties specifically imposed by these bylaws, and attendance
 at executive committee and general membership meetings. Three unexcused absences
 per term of office of any member of the Executive Committee shall be deemed a

- 37 resignation.
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39 (2.3) Chairperson. The Chairperson of the OCC shall have the power to appoint a

40 parliamentarian and the chairperson and members of all standing and special

41 committees unless otherwise specified, with the advice and consent of the OCC. The

42 Chairperson shall be responsible for calling all regular and special meetings of the

- 43 OCC, excusing OCC members from meetings, and the giving of proper notice and
- 44 arranging for meeting places for both regular and special meetings. The Chairperson
- 45 shall also be responsible for attending meetings of the State Central Committee, or of its
- select committees, and reporting the proceedings of such meetings to the next regular

- 47 meeting of the OCC.
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49 (2.4) Vice Chairperson. The Vice Chairperson shall assist the Chairperson and carry out

- 50 the duties and responsibilities of the Chairperson in his or her absence or incapacity
- and/or by delegation. The Vice Chairperson shall also serve as co-chair of the annual
- 52 <u>O'ahu County Convention.</u>
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(2.5) Regional Chairpersons.

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(2.5.1) There shall be not less than eight (8) nor more than thirteen (13) Regional
 Chairpersons, who shall be responsible for the development, coordination, and
 organization of the activities of the Districts and Precincts within their region. The

59 County Committee shall determine the boundaries of the regions to which each

- 60 Regional Chairperson shall be assigned.
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- 62 (2.5.2) The Regional Chairperson shall:
 - (1) Regularly visit each District Council during the year to assist, encourage and communicate District, Regional, County, and State major activities and events;
 - (2) Work with the Districts to strengthen and involve membership in the development of a strong and viable State Democratic Party from the Precincts up to the State Central Committee;
 - (3) Help in the development and growth of the Districts and Precincts through effective membership recruitment by utilizing and involving County and State resources;
 - (4) Be responsible for maintaining communication between the County Committee and District Councils through correspondence, informational memoranda, newsletter and attendance at District Council meetings; and
- 74 (5) Have the duty to represent their regions by attending or being represented at 75 OCC meetings. If a Regional Chairperson does not fulfill this duty, unexcused, for 76 three (3) OCC meetings per term of office, the Regional Chairperson shall 77 automatically give up his/hertheir position as Regional Chair. Any Regional 78 Chairperson may request a hearing, in writing, to challenge the automatic 79 removal from his/hertheir position within fifteen (15) calendar days of the notice 80 of removal. The County Chairperson shall appoint a special committee, within ten 81 (10) calendar days after receiving the request, to conduct a hearing of the 82 circumstances of the removal and submit its recommendation to the County 83 Committee not later than thirty (30) calendar days after being appointed. A copy 84 of the special committee's recommendation shall be given to the Regional 85 Chairperson who requested the hearing. The County Chairperson shall place the matter of consideration of the special committee's recommendation on the 86 87 County Committee's next meeting agenda.
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89 (2.6) Secretary. The Secretary shall keep accurate minutes of all meetings of the OCC,

- 90 its Executive Committee, and O'ahu County Convention. These minutes shall be
- 91 properly typewritten or printed and entered along with all written reports of standing and
- 92 special committees, in a book maintained for that purpose. The minutes shall be

93 available for inspection by interested Democrats at all reasonable times and shall be 94 turned over intact to the succeeding Secretary. 95 96 (2.7) Assistant Secretary. The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in carrying 97 out the various duties assigned to the Secretary and shall perform the duties of the 98 Secretary in the absence of the Secretary-, as well as be the main point of contact 99 between the Precinct Presidents and First-Vice Presidents in coordination with the 100 District Chair to ensure that OCC members' contact information is updated on a regular 101 basis. 102 103 (2.8) Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be responsible for all the fund raising activities 104 within O'ahu County, shall have custody of the OCC treasury, which shall be deposited 105 at a commercial bank in the name of the OCC, and shall submit a report in writing at each regular meeting of the OCC. The Treasurer shall be responsible for seeing that all 106 107 money is collected by duly authorized and identified persons, that receipts are given to 108 all contributors and that a strict accounting is kept of all funds so collected. The 109 Treasurer shall be bonded in a reasonable amount determined by the OCC and the 110 premium shall be paid from OCC funds. The Treasurer shall submit a biennial financial 111 report of the OCC and Districts within O'ahu County to the State Central Committee not 112 later than one week prior to the O'ahu County Convention in every even numbered 113 year. 114 115 (2.9) Assistant Treasurer. The Assistant Treasurer shall assist the Treasurer in carrying out the various duties assigned to the Treasurer and shall perform the duties of the 116 117 Treasurer in the absence of the Treasurer. 118 119 (2.10) O'ahu County State Central Committee Representatives. The O'ahu County 120 State Central Committee Representatives, one male and one female to be elected by 121 the O'ahu County Convention in even-numbered years, shall have the responsibility to 122 ensure that the OCC makes the necessary organizational arrangements to support and 123 implement adopted rules, procedures and practices of the State Convention and the 124 State Central Committee. The O'ahu County State Central Committee Representatives 125 shall be voting members of the Executive Committee and the OCC. 126 127 (2.11) Election of Executive Committee. With the exception of Regional Chairpersons. 128 each member of the Executive Committee shall be elected by a majority of the votes 129 cast at the O'ahu County Convention in odd-numbered years. The Regional 130 Chairpersons shall be elected at the same convention by a majority of votes cast in their 131 respective regions. 132 133 Section 3. Deputy Chairpersons. 134 To assist the County Chairperson with his/hertheir duties, the County Chairperson may 135 appoint not more than eight (8) Deputy Chairpersons with the advice and consent of the 136 Executive Committee. The Deputy Chairpersons shall be non-voting members of the 137 OCC. The responsibility of the Deputy Chairpersons shall be to assist the County

138 Chairperson in the administration of the County Chairperson's responsibilities in

- 139 conducting the affairs of the County Committee. The Deputy Chairpersons shall be
- accountable to the County Chairperson for tasks, assignments and responsibilities in
- 141 conducting the affairs of the County Committee.
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143 Section 4. District Council.

144 (4.1) The District Council in each representative district shall consist of all the precinct

- 145 presidents, first vice-presidents, and District Councilpersons of each precinct, and the 146 duly elected chairperson.
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- 148 (4.2) The District Council Chairperson, on behalf of the District Council, shall be
- responsible to call a precinct organizational meeting of all precinct members of record.
- 150 Members shall be notified pursuant to Article II, Section 4 of the Bylaws of the
- 151 Democratic Party of Hawai'i. The District Council Chairperson shall be responsible to
- 152 initiate the organization of Precinct Clubs when the Executive Committee of the District
- 153 Council declares a Precinct Club inactive. If the District Council Chairperson fails to
- 154 organize the precinct within fifteen (15) days of the declaration, the Chairperson of the
- 155 County Committee shall accept the responsibility to organize the precinct as defined in
- the Constitution and Bylaws of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i.
- 158 (4.3) The District Council Chairperson shall be responsible to coordinate the
- development and organization of the District Council and District Precincts and the
- 160 overall direction of the District Council and District Precinct Clubs.
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- (4.4) The District Council Chairperson shall be responsible to communicate events and
 activities at the Precinct Club level by holding District Council meetings on a regular
 basis and not less than guarterly meetings.
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- (4.5) The District Council Chairperson shall be responsible to maintain an active and
 effective Party organization within the district and precincts to ensure as large a voter
 turnout as possible for Democratic Party candidates in elections.
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- 170 (4.6) The District Council Chairperson shall have the power and duty to appoint
- 171 chairpersons and members of all standing and special committees with the advice and
- consent of the majority of the members of the District Council.
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- (4.7) District Council Chairpersons shall have the duty to represent their districts by
 attending or being represented at OCC meetings. If a District Council Chairperson does
- not fulfill this duty, unexcused, for three (3) OCC meetings per term of office, the District
- 177 Council Chairperson shall automatically give up his/hertheir position as District Chair.
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- Any District Council Chairperson may request a hearing, in writing, to challenge the
- automatic removal from his/hertheir position within fifteen (15) calendar days of the
- 181 notice of removal. The County Chairperson shall appoint a special committee, within ten
- 182 (10) calendar days after receiving the request, to conduct a hearing of the
- 183 circumstances of the removal and submit its recommendation to the County Committee
- not later than thirty (30) calendar days after being appointed. A copy of the special

185 committee's recommendation shall be given to the District Council Chairperson who 186 requested the hearing. The County Chairperson shall place the matter of consideration 187 of the special committee's recommendation on the County Committee's next meeting 188 agenda. 189 190 (4.8) Precinct Presidents shall be responsible for calling and running Precinct meetings, 191 welcoming new members and recruiting Democrats within their Precinct to the 192 Democratic Party, and assisting in recruiting volunteers from their precinct to help with 193 campaign activities for the General Election as well as helping find poll watchers for the 194 General Election. 195 196 (4.9) Precinct First Vice-President shall be responsible for assisting the O'ahu County 197 Secretary in gathering and updating the contact information for their precinct members. 198 They shall assist the Precinct President with their duties. 199 200 Section 5. Eligibility & Election. 201 (5.1) Eligibility. Any member of the Party residing in the County may be elected an 202 officer of the County Committee including County Chairperson, with the requirement 203 that any member seeking the office of County Chairperson shall have been a member 204 of the Party for at least one (1) year prior to the County Committee Officers election. 205 Elected officials, individuals appointed to fill an elected office, or candidates for elected 206 office are not eligible to become County Chairperson. If a member has resigned from 207 the Party in the two years prior to re-enrollment, the re-enrolled member must be a 208 member in good standing for at least one year prior to the County Committee Officers 209 election prior to being elected an officer of the County Committee. 210 211 If a District Chairperson, Precinct President, Precinct First Vice-President or a Precinct District Councilperson is elected as a County officer, that person shall automatically 212 213 vacate the lesser office. Any person who wishes to be a candidate for Chairperson, 214 Vice-Chairperson, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer or Regional Chairperson shall file nomination papers at least ten (10) days prior to the 215 County Convention. The nomination papers shall be signed by not less than ten (10) 216 217 members of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i residing in the County or Region being 218 represented. 219 220 (5.2) OCC members shall not be nominated for more than one office on the executive 221 committee. 222 223 (5.2) Elections. Election(s) shall be decided by a majority of votes cast. Election(s) shall 224 be by secret ballot unless there is only one nominee for a particular position in which 225 case election shall be by acclamation. In contested races, candidates may speak for 226 two minutes each prior to the vote. Election(s) shall be conducted using a single, first 227 ballot; provided, however, that each region shall have separate ballots to elect Regional 228 Chairs where more than one candidate is running for the same position. If no candidate 229 receives a majority on the first ballot, then a second ballot between the top two vote-230 getters shall be conducted. Subsequent ties shall be decided by the flip of a coin.

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232 Section 6. Term of Office.

233 Term of Office. Immediately following the adjournment of the O'ahu County Convention 234 in odd-numbered years, the OCC Executive Committee shall organize and take office 235 immediately and shall hold office until the adjournment of the next O'ahu County 236 Convention held in an odd-numbered year, except for OCC State Central Committee 237 Representatives who shall hold office until the next O'ahu County Convention in an

- 238 even-numbered year.
- 239

240 Section 7. Vacancies.

- 241 (7.1)-In the event of a vacancy in the office of County Chairperson, the Vice Chair 242 becomes the acting chair and a new Chair shall be elected by the general membership 243 of the O'ahu County Committee within 30 days after the commencement of the 244 vacancy. The vacancy shall be deemed to have commenced on the date that the Vice 245 Chair receives written notice of resignation by the Chair, or upon the death of the Chair, 246 or upon a determination by the Executive Committee that the Chair is incapacitated. At 247 the election to fill the vacancy, the Vice Chair may choose to be a candidate for Chair. If
- the Vice Chair is not elected Chair, the Vice Chair resumes service as Vice Chair. If the 248

249 Vice Chair is elected Chair, then the general membership shall immediately thereafter

- 250 elect a new Vice Chair at the same meeting.
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252 County Chairperson: In the event of a vacancy in the office of County Chairperson, the

253 Vice Chairperson shall become Chairperson and a new Vice Chairperson shall be

254 elected by the OCC in accordance with the following procedures. In the event of a

- 255 vacancy in both the office of County Chairperson and Vice Chairperson, both the
- 256 County Chairperson and Vice Chairperson shall be elected by the OCC in accordance with the following procedures.
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259 The OCC Secretary shall notify all members of the OCC within ten (10) calendar days of 260 notification of the occurrence of the vacancy. Any member of the OCC who wishes to 261 nominate a person to fill the vacancy may select a nominee from any member of the 262 Democratic Party who fulfills the eligibility requirements in Section 5, and may nominate 263 such person to fill the vacancy by forwarding a statement to that effect, signed by the 264 nominee to the Secretary within the deadline established by the Secretary in the notice 265 of vacancy or within ten (10) calendar days after notification, whichever is greater.

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267 The Secretary shall then prepare a notice of election meeting, designating the time, 268 place and purpose of the meeting, which shall include the names of all nominees for the 269 office of County Vice Chairperson and/or Chairperson. Such notice shall be mailed or 270 emailed ten (10) calendar days prior to the meeting to all members of the OCC.

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272 All members present at the election meeting may vote from among the nominees, and 273 the nominee receiving the highest number of votes shall immediately assume office.

274 Proxy voting shall be prohibited, and voting by secret ballot may only be waived by a

275 majority vote.

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- 277 Only members of the OCC shall be eligible to vote to fill the vacancy in the office of the
- 278 County Vice Chairperson or Chairperson. Should the newly elected County Vice
- 279 Chairperson or Chairperson be an existing OCC officer, he/she shall vacate such office
- held and a replacement shall be selected by the OCC.
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- 282 (7.2) Other Members of the Executive Committee. Any other vacancies on the
- Executive Committee shall be filled by appointment by the County Chairperson on an interim basis until confirmed by the County Committee at it's next meeting.
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(7.3) If a Regional Chairperson, District Council Chairperson, District Council Officer,
 Precinct President or any other Precinct Officer is elected or appointed to any officer
 position on the OCC Executive Committee that person shall automatically vacate the
 lesser office.

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291 Section 8. Quorum.

- The quorum at any meeting shall be 33% of the sitting members of the respective body.
- 293 This rule does not apply to Precinct Clubs and District Councils. Participation via
- 294 electronic means, such as teleconference or video conference, shall constitute
- participation for the purposes of voting and establishing a quorum so long as and for as
- long as all persons participating are able to hear each other at the same time. Each
- matter shall be decided by the majority vote of those participating.
- 298

299 Section 9. Proxies.

- 300 (9.1) A District Council Chairperson may give his/hertheir proxy to another officer of 301 his/hertheir District Council in accordance with Article III - "District Council" of the 302 Bylaws of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i. All proxies must be in writing and shall be 303 filed with the Secretary of the OCC and the OCC Chairperson. In the absence of the 304 District Chairperson, the First Vice Chairperson shall have the right to vote and 305 represent the District without further designation or proxy. The District Chairperson shall 306 still be considered absent even though a proxy has been given unless excused by the 307 OCC Chairperson.
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- (9.2) A Regional Chairperson may give his/hertheir proxy to a District Council officer in
 his/hertheir region. All proxies must be in writing and shall be filed with the Secretary of
 the OCC and the OCC Chairperson. The Regional Chairperson shall still be considered
 absent even though a proxy has been given unless excused by the OCC Chairperson.
 An unexcused absence can be appealed to the OCC Executive Committee, but only at
 the next OCC Executive Committee meeting.
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316 Section 10. Meetings, Notices, Attendance at Meetings.

- 317 (10.1) Immediately after the adjournment of the O'ahu County Convention, the new
- 318 Oʻahu County Committee shall meet.
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- 320 (10.2) Regular Meetings. Regular meetings of the OCC shall be held at least once every
- 321 three (3) months at such time and place as the members may decide. Notice of
- 322 meetings shall be given in person, by fax, electronic mail, by telephone or by mailing

323 such notice to the last known address of each member not less than five (5) calendar 324 days prior to the meeting. 325 326 (10.3) Special Meetings. Special meetings of the OCC may be held at any time by call 327 of the County Chairperson or upon written request submitted to the Secretary or 328 Chairperson by not less than thirty-three and 1/3 percent (33 1/3%) of the total seated 329 membership. Notice of special meetings shall be given in person, by fax, electronic mail, 330 or by telephone or by mailing such notice to the last known address of each member not 331 less than five (5) calendar days prior to the meeting. 332 333 (10.4) Executive Session Meetings. Normally all OCC meetings are open to all 334 Democratic Party members. Under exceptional circumstances, the OCC may decide to 335 go into executive session to deal with a confidential matter. The decision to go into 336 executive session shall require a two-thirds (2/3) vote of OCC members in attendance. 337 338 (10.5) Members who are entitled may participate in OCC meetings or committee 339 meetings by means of teleconference, videoconference, or by any means of a 340 communication technology by which all persons participating in the meeting can speak 341 to and hear each other at the same time. Participation by such means shall constitute 342 attendance at the meeting so long as and for as long as such simultaneous 343 communication is active and enabled. 344 345 Section 11. Standing and Special Committees. (11.1) There shall be standing committees on rules, finance, organization, patronage, 346 347 legislation, membership, elections and convention planning. At least one of the co-348 chairs of each committee shall be a member of the OCC and shall be appointed by the 349 Chair with advise and consent of the OCC. Membership of the committees is open to 350 any member of the O'ahu County Democrats. 351 352 (11.2) Rules Committee. A member of the Executive Committee shall act as 353 chairperson of the Rules Committee which shall be responsible for reviewing and 354 proposing updates to OCC Rules, the convention standing rules, and these Bylaws. 355 356 (11.3) Finance Committee. The OCC Treasurer shall act as chairperson of the Finance 357 Committee, which shall be responsible for the raising of and accounting for funds within 358 O'ahu County as well as prepare the biennial budget... 359 360 (11.4) Organization Committee. The Organization Committee shall help organize or 361 reorganize new or inactive District Councils and Precinct Clubs, encourage the 362 registration of voters and compile necessary and pertinent information on voting within 363 O'ahu County. 364 365 (11.5) Patronage Committee. The Patronage Committee shall be responsible for receiving, processing, and forwarding to the proper persons all endorsements made in 366 367 accord with these bylaws and for obtaining and compiling information on job openings 368 and forwarding such information to the precincts.

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370	(11.6) Legislation Committee. The Legislation Committee shall be charged with
371	compiling information and promoting action on legislative projects in keeping with the
372	O'ahu County Democratic Party Platform, drafting or having drafted appropriate
373	measures and cooperating with the proper officials and members of the Federal, State,
374	and County legislative bodies, and other agencies and organizations, in having such
375	legislation introduced and passed. The ChairpersonOne of the co-chairs of the
376	Legislation Committee shall report to the OCC at its regular meetings on the activities of
377	the Legislation Committee, and on the cooperation received from various officials and
378	board members. At least one of the co-chairs shall represent the OCC on the State
379	Central Committee's Legislative Committee.
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381	(11.7) Membership Committee. The Membership Committee shall be responsible for
382	coordinating recruitment of new members and/or membership drives, develop and
383	maintain of onboarding procedures for new members, encourage the registration of
384	voters, as well as coordinating membership enhancements. The chair or co-chair or
385	their disgnee shall represent the OCC on the State Central Committee's Membership
386	Committee.
387	
388	(11.87) Convention Planning Committee. The Convention Planning Committee shall be
389	responsible for planning and organizing annual and special county conventions. The
390	site selection recommendations and budget shall be presented to and be subject to the
391	approval of the County Executive Committee.
392	
393	(11.9) Elections Committee. The Elections Committee shall be responsible for planning
394	and organizing regular and special elections of county officers at county conventions
395	and/or between conventions as needed and as provided by these bylaws. No member
396 397	of this committee may be candidate for county committee office.
397 398	(11. <u>10</u> 8) Special Committees. The County Chairperson may create special committees
398 399	as may be necessary to accomplish tasks consistent with the mission of the O'ahu
400	County organization and not otherwise within the charge of existing standing
401	committees.
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403	Section 12. Duties and Responsibilities of the O'ahu County Committee (OCC).
404	(12.1) It shall be the duty of the OCC to establish and maintain an active and effective
405	Democratic Party organization within the City and County of Honolulu, to inform
406	Democrats within the County of Democratic Party policy and activities and to insure as
407	large a vote as possible for Democratic Party candidates in the election.
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409	(12.2) To effect attain these endsgoals, the OCC shall take such steps as necessary to
410	encourage officials of the County, elected and appointed in the name of the Democratic
411	Party to observe the platforms and principles of the O'ahu County Democrats and the
412	Democratic Party of Hawai'i.
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414	(12.3) It shall be the duty of the OCC to cooperate in the carrying out of the policies and

- 415 programs of the State Central Committee.
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- 417 (12.4) The O'ahu County Committee shall adopt and endeavor to adhere to a biennial
- 418 budget. The biennium shall be defined by the OCC. Not later than six months before the
- 419 commencement of a budget biennium, the Finance Committee shall draft a budget and
- 420 <u>submit it to the chair for consideration by the O'ahu County Committee not less than</u>
- 421 sixty (60) days before the commencement of the budget biennium. The budget may be
- 422 <u>amended by a majority vote of the O'ahu County Committee. The County Chair shall</u>

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428 Section 13. County Convention: Time and Notices.

- 429 (13.1) The annual convention of the O'ahu County Democrats shall be held at least
- three (3) weeks prior to the State Convention in even-numbered years, and the time of
- the meeting shall be fixed by the OCC. Special conventions may be called in
- 432 accordance with the O'ahu County bylaws, rules and convention rules. The officers of
- the OCC shall be elected in odd-numbered years. O'ahu County State Central
- 434 Committee Representatives are elected in even-numbered years in accordance with the
- 435 Constitution of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i.

- (13.2) All delegates and alternate delegates to the County Convention shall be notified
 by mail or email of the time and place thereof at least thirty sixty (6030) calendar days
 prior to the date of the County Convention.
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441 (13.3) The convention committees shall meet at least seven (7) days prior to the County
 442 Convention. These committees shall accept submissions at the convention committee
 443 meetings with a 2/3 vote of the convention committee members present.

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- 445 (13.43) The delegate body of the Convention shall be comprised as follows.
- 446 A. Each District shall have twenty-four (24) delegates.
 - 1. The President, First Vice President, and District Council Person of each precinct shall be delegates to the O'ahu County Convention.
 - Delegates shall be elected at the time of the Precinct Elections as prescribed by the Constitution and Bylaws of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i.
- 4523.If fewer than twenty-four delegates are elected because the State House453District has fewer than eight (8) precincts, a number of At Large delegates454to the O'ahu County Convention shall be allotted equal to the number of455precincts in the district, multiplied by three (3), and then subtracted from456twenty four (24).

462	B. Each District shall make every effort to elect delegates composed of equal

467	D. Other Precinct officers shall not be precluded from running as a delegate.
468	E. If, following the Precinct Elections, there remain vacant At-Large delegate
469	positions, the District Council shall be empowered to fill the remaining positions,
470	up until ten (10) days prior to the convention, after that the District Chair shall be
471	empowered, provided that;
472	 Best attempts are made to ensure gender equity is maintained; and
473	 District Council meetings to fill vacancies shall be conducted by phone or

475	iii. Appointments shall be in writing.
476	F. If an elected delegate cannot attend, they may appoint their own alternate
477	provided that they notify the District Chairperson in writing at least ten (10) days
478	prior to the convening of the convention and;
479	i. The appointed alternate reside in the district; and
480 481	ii. A best effort is made to ensure the selected alternate is of the same gender
481	as the elected delegate; and iii. An alternate shall act for no more than one (1) delegate at a time; and
482	iv. If the elected delegate does not appoint an alternate ten (10) days prior to
484	the convening of the Convention, the District Chairperson shall be
485	empowered to appoint the alternate, provided that a best effort is made to
486	appoint an alternate of the same gender as the elected delegate.
487	G. Each delegate to the O'ahu County Convention is entitled to one (1) vote.
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489	(13.54) Elected federal, state and County officials, or officials who may have been
490	appointed to fill a vacant position of an elected official, who currently serve in office and
491	are not precinct presidents, precinct first vice presidents, or precinct district
492	councilpersons, shall have all the rights and privileges of a delegate subject to the
493	following requirements:
494	 Be a member of the Democratic Party in good standing; and
495	2. Have attained their present office in a partisan election as a Democrat or have
496	been appointed to fill a vacant position of an elected official, or have attained
497	their present office in a non-partisan State or County election, provided they are
498	Democratic Party members in good standing and residents of O'ahu.

500	(13. <u>6</u> 5) Former Democratic Governors, Lt. Governors, Oʻahu Mayors, State Party
501	Chairs, and O'ahu County Committee Chairs, and the current state party chair who are
502	not precinct presidents, precinct first vice presidents, or precinct district councilpersons,
503	shall have all the rights and privileges of delegates so long as they are members of the
504 505	Democratic Party of Hawai'i in good standing, and residents of O'ahu and ran for their
505 506	elected office as a member of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i.

(13.76) The Co-Chairs and members of the Convention Committees of Rules, 507 508 Affirmative Action, Platform, Credentials and Resolutions shall be appointed by the 509 County Chairperson, in keeping with the Party's commitment to gender equity, from 510 among the Convention delegates without additional approval. 511 512 (13.8) Voting members of the Convention Committees of Rules, Affirmative Action, 513 Platform, Credentials and Resolution shall be delegates to the O'ahu County 514 Convention. If at all possible the voting members shall be evenly divided between the 515 regions. The members shall be appointed by the County Chariperson with 516 recommendations of County Convention Committee Co-Chairs without additional approval. Each committee shall not exceed 5% of the total eligible county convention 517 518 delegates. 519 520 (13.9) All members of the O'ahu County Democrats are invited to attend and voice their 521 opinions in the Convention Committee meetings that take place prior to the annual 522 County Convention. 523 524 Section 14. County Convention Rules. 525 (14.1) The O'ahu County Committee may adopt rules for the proper conduct of O'ahu 526 County Convention business not inconsistent or in conflict with the Constitution and 527 Bylaws of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i and, except for rules regarding submission 528 format and deadlines, are subject to amendment by Convention delegates. 529 530 (14.2) The platform and resolutions adopted by delegates at conventions of the O'ahu 531 County Democrats shall remain in force and effect until rescinded or amended by a two-532 thirds roll call vote of the full membership of the O'ahu County Committee or by a 533 majority of votes cast by delegates at an annual or special convention, or until they 534 come into conflict with the platform or resolutions of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i. 535 536 (14.3) Resolutions to be considered at a county convention in a non-state convention year must be relevant exclusively to citizens and Democrats residing in the City & 537 County of Honolulu. Furthermore, any resolution adopted at a county convention in a 538 539 non State Convention year will not be referred by O'ahu County to a future State 540 Convention. 541 542 (14.4) Resolutions adopted may be edited & reformatted by the secretary as needed to correct spelling and grammar and to conform with the convention submission rules, the 543 544 posted and published resolutions of the county, and the format described in Robert's 545 Rules of Order Newly Revised. 546 547 Section 15. Adoption and Amendment of O'ahu County Bylaws. 548 (15.1) Proposals to amend or revise these bylaws may be adopted by a two-thirds vote 549 at any annual or special O'ahu County Convention. The OCC shall submit the proposed 550 bylaws or bylaw changes to the State Central Committee within ninety (90) calendar 551 days of adoption. Upon the determination by the State Central Committee that the 552 proposed bylaws or bylaw changes are not inconsistent or in conflict with the

- 553 Constitution and Bylaws of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i, the bylaws of the O'ahu
- 554 County Democrats and bylaw changes shall become effective.

- 556 (15.2) In the event the State Central Committee fails to ratify the proposed bylaws or

- ratification, or if the same are not ratified in accordance with this section, then the duly

- to the O'ahu County Democrats and the O'ahu County Committee.

- 56516. Parliamentary Procedure Guidance.
- 566 The rules of parliamentary procedure as set forth in the current edition of *Robert's Rules*
- 567 of Order Newly Revised, shall guide the O'ahu County Committee and govern all
- 568 proceedings not provided for in these bylaws, so long as the rules of parliamentary
- 569 procedure are reasonably applicable and not inconsistent or in conflict with the
- 570 Constitution and Bylaws of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i.
