This message is to provide you with the basic instructions to properly submit a Platform Plank to our Committee for consideration and potential adoption by the delegates at the O`ahu County eConvention on May 1, 2021.

The dictionary defines a Plank as a stated fundamental or general law, a principle and a guiding sense of something to stand on or cling to.

As such, we are requesting Planks on which the platform will be built. Examples from the current Platform include: Education, Reducing Prescription Drug Costs, Reproductive Health Rights, etc.

Please limit your submissions to your top five (5) Platform Planks and submit them in accordance with Rule 5 of the Standing Rules of the 2021 O`ahu County Democrats eConvention to be held on May 1, 2021.

Rule 5 sets out the procedures for submitting proposed Platform Planks and is summarized as follows:


- The proposers of all Platform Planks shall submit proposals by email attachment in a Microsoft Word compatible format (8.5" by 11"); using Arial 10 font, with one-inch margins on all sides, as used here.
- Each proposal shall be no longer than one page and submitted by e-mail to Platform@oahudemocrats.org
- Email Submissions should have the subject line read, "2021 OCD eConvention Platform"
- The body of the email should include the following information:
 - Type of proposal (Platform Plank),
 - o The title of the document (File Name),
 - Name of moving Delegate, and
 - o The software program (For example: Microsoft Word) used for submission.
- All proposed platform planks must be received before 4:30pm on April 2, 2021.
- All submissions must be supported by another member as a second which must be verified by a separate email to the respective committee email within the submission deadline.

Please note that the Platform Committee will only consider the proposed Platform Planks that relate specifically and exclusively to O'ahu County issues and the work of the O'ahu County Committee and its committees.


