Mālama Maunalua is one of the organizations working to improve the quality of life in our region. It was founded in 2005 by community members concerned about the decline of Maunalua Bay and seeking to restore the health of the bay. How did they plan do this? By working with public agencies, private organizations, and the community. Their process? Planning, education, and outreach.

One of Mālama Maunalua's most visible successes was The Great Huki Project started in 2010. That activity engaged 3,000 community members who removed three million pounds of invasive algae from 23 acres of Maunalua Bay adjacent to Pāiko beach. Removed algae was recycled as compost by five local farmers to generate fresh produce. Monitoring of the project area has shown efforts to be successful as native algae and marine species return and multiply.

In addition to the physical clearing of harmful algae from the bay, Mālama Maunalua conducts educational sessions with schools and community groups to help the community better understand the mauka to makai connection. Current projects include coral reef restoration and the CPR (Cherish, Protect, and Restore) initiative. For more information about these and other opportunities, go to www.malamamaunalua.org.
