What's Been Happening?

In 2019, the Legislation Committee set out to create our first legislative summary to get the opinions of Oʻahu Democrats directly to our leaders in the Senate, House of Representatives, and Honolulu City Council. This summer, the third Legislative Priorities survey was shared with members to solicit input on where the most work was needing on issues like public education, affordable housing, healthcare, earning a living wage, climate change, and more. **Mahalo to those of you who took the time to help create a baseline for our work!**

Radiant Cordero's Summer of Service

As the summer months heated up, so did a series of service projects in a part of Honolulu's urban core. Honolulu City Councilmember Radiant Cordero (Honolulu City Councilmember District 7 — Ford Island to Liliha/Iwilei, OCC District 32 Chair, and Hawai'i's Young Democrats of America National Committee representative) launched her "Summer of Service" from the months of May to August 2021. The effort was to partner with community organizations, students, neighbors, and more to lead and participate in a series of projects that show how we care for our community. Efforts included graffiti and trash cleanups at parks and properties that face state/city jurisdiction issues.







Events were also held to address caring for our environment and water restoration efforts from stream cleanups in Kalihi Valley to partnering with the Polynesian Voyaging Society and Honolulu Community College to make "genki balls." These devices, which are made from natural materials geared to clean up sludge from waterways, were created then released a month later into a Kapālama loʻi within Councilmember Cordero's district.

As the pandemic continues, the Summer of Service events also included five vaccination events all before the month of August, plus donation drives for kupuna, guest leading online exercise and dance classes for kupuna, and food drives. O'ahu Democrats Membership Committee Co-Chair Chris Edwards worked with Councilmember Cordero to organize food distribution efforts at Feeding Hawai'i Together's "The Pantry" in Kalihi during Statehood Day. The energetic volunteers saw some of The Pantry's largest number of deliveries and food pickups that day.
